



No regrets! Divine Mercy Sunday

Mercy comes from the Latin word misericordia, which means God's Heart desiring to alleviate our misery. In answer to the second question above, do you know anyone that is in misery and wants to stay there? Bottom line, it is sin that causes our misery. How can we best receive God's mercy? Let's take a closer look.

Years ago a kid had these words, "No regrets," tattooed onto his body. I wonder if he's having regrets now. As human beings we discover early and often that we're flawed. What we do with our flaws will determine many things, not the least of which is where we'll spend eternity.

Honesty and humility: We all know good people who are worthy of our imitation. Something in them awakens in us a deep desire to be remarkable, to live a beautiful life. But how do we do it? Two things indispensable to becoming what we are meant to be are honesty and humility. Honest people realize that they miss the mark many times and reject some of the good things God wants to give us. This is called sin. Honest people know they are sinners and this protects them from blaming others or playing the victim. However, what protects them from the shame and guilt that so often accompany sin is humility. Humility acknowledges that I need help and in such dependence on others, and ultimately on God Himself, I find true freedom. So, are you honest about your struggles? Do you humbly ask God for His help so that by His grace you can live a joy-filled life? You can do both of these at the same time.

Divine Mercy: Pope Francis spoke recently of Divine Mercy by telling the following story: "I remember when I was an auxiliary bishop, in 1992 the pilgrim statue of Our Lady of Fatima came to Buenos Aires and a great Mass took place for the sick. I went to hear confessions at this Mass, and at the end of it I got up to administer the anointing of the sick. And an old woman came to me – humble, very humble, and over 80. I looked at her and told her: "Grandma – because for us that's what we call the elderly – nonna: do you want to go to confession?" "Yes," she told me." [I said] "But if you haven't sinned...." And she said to me: "We've all sinned." "But maybe the Lord doesn't forgive them" [I said]. "The Lord forgives everyone," she said: surely. "But how do you know that, ma'am?" "If the Lord didn't forgive everything, the world wouldn't exist." Why did she say this? Sin destroys and so a world without forgiveness would destroy itself. Think of the World Wars. The woman described above understands this and exhibits deep faith, remarkable honesty, and true humility.

Confession: For us to get to Heaven our hearts have to be open to a gift that we could never merit. The gift is being with God and we can't receive this gift without forgiveness of our sin. How can we know if our hearts are prepared to receive such a gift? *(cont. next column)*

The Church has long taught that God refuses no one who approaches Him with a humble, contrite heart. Going to confession is the surest way to open our hearts and is an exercise in both honesty and humility. Make a good confession this year, especially if it's been a long time. For those who go to confession regularly, encourage someone else to come back to this healing Sacrament of Divine Mercy. Only in this way will the regrets, the miseries of our lives, be turned to the joy God gives to those who trust in Him! Let us celebrate the Feast of Divine Mercy with gratitude for God's forgiveness of our sins and the inevitable healing that ensues.
