

TIME TO PREPARE

As Advent is upon us, it is a perfect time to ask ourselves; how are we preparing for the Christmas season? Although this may seem a foolish question, for isn't the Christmas season upon us? The answer is no, despite what the retailers and on-line offers are selling, it is not Christmas until we celebrate the birth of Christ. This is a time of waiting and preparing our hearts. If we simply rush from one activity to another, from one store to another, from one on-line order to another we will miss what is perhaps the biggest blessing this season offers. A time to wait patiently, a time to let the excitement build, a time to prepare our hearts for the One who made them for himself.

This is how we *Put Christ back into Christmas*. The stores are not going to do this; the news media is not going to do this and the internet or the movies are not going to do this. If this is our desire, each family has to make the effort, one by one, joining with like-minded families; changing the culture bit by bit. The Church has her role to play in this as well, to lead by example not to get too far ahead of ourselves.

Liturgically, the Church's year begins with the first Sunday of Advent, and can be considered 'a little lent' because Advent is a time of penance as we prepare for the birth of Christ. It is a silent time of anticipation and hope. St. Charles Borromeo writes: "Each year, as the Church recalls this mystery, she urges us to renew the memory of the great love God has shown us. This holy season teaches us that Christ's coming was not only for the benefit of his contemporaries; his power has still to be communicated to us all... The Church asks us to understand that Christ, who came once in the flesh, is prepared to come again. When we remove all obstacles to his presence he will come, at any hour and moment, to dwell spiritually in our hearts, bringing with him the riches of his grace."

Preparing in this way doesn't simply happen to us. We have a part to play. We have to make it a priority in our lives and in the life of our family. If Christmas seems to be nothing more than a drain on the family; a time of shopping, eating and drinking; non-stop activity and music that you can't wait to be done with; try something new this year. If Advent becomes a time of reading, reflecting, praying and waiting, Christmas, *all 12 days*, can become a time of celebration. We will close with another reflection from St Charles Borromeo:

"Beloved, now is the acceptable time spoken of by the Spirit, the day of salvation, peace and reconciliation: the great season of Advent. This is the time eagerly awaited by the patriarchs and prophets, the time that holy Simeon rejoiced at last to see. (cont. next column) This is the season that the Church has always celebrated with special solemnity. We too should always observe it with faith and love, offering praise and thanksgiving to the Father for the mercy and love he has shown us in this mystery."
