POPE BENEDICT XVI RESIGNS

This is a subject I never thought I would ever write about. It hasn't happened for almost 600 years, and never for the reasons Pope Benedict has given. He has stated that since he is no longer able to perform the duties required of the papacy due to health and age, he is resigning at the end of February. What this means, and how it will all play out remains to be seen. Speculation on who the next Pope will be is already rampant on the internet, with everyone having a say. There are even odds makers in Las Vegas making wagers. In a day of instant news on the internet and 24 hour news programs all striving to be the first to break a story, one thing is certain; this will be one of the most talked about event for a long time. But there is another aspect to this story that will drive the pundits crazy; it is the most secretive event as well. Once the Cardinals go into conclave, there will be an absolute media blackout. And once they name a new Pope, there will be no interviews on how the discussions within the conclave progressed.

We do know, however, the method. All Cardinals under the age of 80 when the seat of Peter becomes vacant (8:00 PM on Feb 28) will go into conclave a week or two later. The specific date will not be set until after the seat becomes empty, but will likely be soon after because there will be no time of mourning due to the death of the pontiff. After the conclave begins, there are normally 4 votes each day; 2 in the morning and 2 in the afternoon. This continues until one candidate receives 2/3 of the votes. If there is no decision after 13 days, there is a day of prayer and reflection before resuming the voting. At this time, the voting is between the 2 leading candidates until one reaches the 2/3 majority.

The most important point in all of this is the fact that ultimately, the Holy Spirit is in charge. No one expected John Paul I would die 33 days into his papacy. No one expected a young cardinal from Poland would be named to succeed him, or that John Paul II would serve one of the longest terms in the history of the Church. And very few expected a German cardinal to follow in his footsteps. And although John Paul II's last years were a great witness to the dignity of human suffering, and Pope Benedict XVI has stated many times that a pope could resign if he determined it would be best for the Church, no one expected this day would come. Benedict's witness is one of humility and love for the Church.

I don't think it is an accident that Pope Benedict has made this move during the *Year of Faith*, nor at this time, the beginning of our Lenten period. It took a great leap of faith for him to step aside; faith in the Church and faith in the Holy Spirit; that He will guide the Barque of Peter through these unchartered waters. This decision also comes at the beginning of our Lenten journey in this *Year of Faith*.

Let us offer our sacrifices and prayers in a special way this lent for our Holy Father Benedict XVI, for the man the Holy Spirit has already selected, for our Church and for ourselves; that we may grow in our faith and deepen our relationship with the Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
