

Habemus Papam! We Have a Pope!

White smoke billowed from the small smokestack atop the Sistine Chapel at 1:10 p.m. (7:10 p.m. Rome time) on Wednesday, March 13th. This is the traditional announcement to the world that the Church has a new Pope!

Cardinal Jorge Mario Bergoglio, S.J., of Buenos Aires, Argentina was elected as Pope by his fellow Cardinals. The election of our new Holy Father took place on the second day of the Conclave, on the fifth ballot. He has taken the name Francis, after Saint Francis of Assisi in his desire to invoke the simplicity of that saint and his concern for the poor.

In his first act as Pope, Francis led all to pray the Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be for his predecessor, Benedict XVI. Pope Francis is the 266th successor of St. Peter, who was chosen by Jesus Christ to be the head of the Catholic Church. It is interesting to note that he has already set a precedent in three ways. He is the first Jesuit Pope, the first Pope from South America, and the first Pope to take the name Francis.

In watching Pope Francis emerge on the central balcony of St. Peter's Basilica, it is obvious that he is a humble, gentle man who emanates joy as a person totally committed to Jesus Christ. After greeting the people in Italian: "Brothers and sisters, good evening," he said, "As you know the duty of the conclave is to give Rome a bishop. It seems that my brother cardinals went almost to the end of the earth to find him." The enthusiasm was explosive as the crowd of more than 100,000 pilgrims in the Vatican Square chanted "Viva il Papa".

Pope Francis then asked the crowd for a favor: a moment of prayer for him. In the vast crowd of people in the Vatican Square and all the way down the main boulevard, there was complete silence. This time was not simply an interval without noise but an incredible moment of intense spiritual closeness as all bowed their head and prayed fervently to God for our new Shepherd. It was so stunningly quiet that ABC News thought that they had lost their audio! The new Vicar of Christ, a gentleman with great intelligence and a deep spiritual life, is well-known in Latin America where 40% of the world's Catholics live. There have been tears of joy in the streets as the people of South America rejoice over the new "Pope of the People." Pope Francis is known for his simple way of life, living in a small, modest apartment, taking the bus to work, and being a champion of the poor by frequently visiting dangerous slums.

He made a visit on Thursday morning to St. Mary Major, one of the Basilica's of Rome, in order to place a bouquet of flowers in front of her image, entitled Mary, Help of the People of Rome and to spend a good amount of time there in prayer.

We know from his pastoral leadership in Argentina that Pope Francis is a strong defender of Catholic teaching, seeking to protect marriage and family life, and is a strong champion for children, including the unborn. He is impassioned to make the Church present to the people of the world. In speaking to the Cardinals on Friday, Pope Francis said, "We must continue the mission to bring Jesus Christ to all men and to bring all men to an encounter with Christ, Who is 'the Way, the Truth, and the Life.' The Holy Spirit gives new methods to bring the Gospel to the ends of the earth. The world is desperate for Christ, the only Savior of men. This is still valid as it was at the beginning of Christianity."
