



LOVE AND FAITH

If you stand too close to Niagara Falls, a wall of the Grand Canyon, or a Van Gogh, all you'll see is rushing water, a slab of red rock, and some thick paint that could have been slapped onto a canvas by a kindergartener. With some things you can't capture the beauty unless you step back and see the big picture.

Marriage is like that. What if you could only see one aspect of what marriage is all about: the sacrifices you have to make?

- You get to give up all your closet space.
- You get to never keep your money to yourself ever again.

You get to report your whereabouts to someone else...at all times.

If that's all there was, few things would be as unattractive as marriage. But if you take a step back and see marriage in the context of love: That you get to give your life to a beautiful woman who gives hers in exchange, and the result is an explosion of more life that forever changes the universe; Suddenly all those sacrifices seem small, or at least worth making!

The same is true with faith. When we forget "the big picture," Christianity usually strikes people as no more than disjointed doctrines to learn, repressive rules to follow, and if you're a Catholic, you'll top that off with a few irrational rituals. There's no doubt that the world caricaturizes Christianity, and Christians in this way.

If you don't know how we Christians who are engaged in pro-life or pro-"traditional" marriage" work are seen by the world, just turn on your TV. Media often depicts us as unloving, angry moralists who are out of touch with the needs of people in the "real" world.

It's an inaccurate and unfair caricaturization, no doubt. I know plenty of pro-lifers who are devoting their lives to proclaiming the Gospel of life, and the only motive they bring to the abortion clinics they pray outside of is love. They are ever ready to show the compassion of Jesus to the women being lied to by abortionists who care more about "cash or credit?" than they do about walking with them through their fear and offering them positive alternatives. But regardless, perception is reality, and the world's caricaturizations are a very real obstacle to the Gospel being proclaimed to the Western World today. When the average non-Christian looks at a cross and sees a sign of intolerance or repression, it's safe to say we have a serious messaging problem.
