THE YEAR OF FAITH:

A reflection by Fr David Olson

What is spiritual blindness?

The Gospels often use physical ailments to point out many things much more difficult to diagnose. For instance, they will use a story of a withered hand to reflect on how sin affects our hearts and souls; and they will use deafness to point out how we often have difficulties hearing God's Word, and they will use stories of physical blindness to point out our spiritual blindness. Spiritual blindness can and does affect all of us to some degree or another, but there is a cure as well

Spiritual blindness is when we want the wrong things and then choose the wrong things. It is when we are blind to what God wants for us. Sometimes its effects are obvious, but sometimes it is just a nagging sense that all the things in my life just aren't fulfilling. The result is our relationship with God and those around us is not right.

Spiritual blindness begins with Original Sin. Original Sin is the name we give to what our first ancestors, Adam and Eve, did that separated them from God through the loss of grace. To be sure, the story of Adam and Eve is told in a figurative way. It is, however meant to convey a great truth about them and consequently about us.

Our first parents had a special relationship with God, but they sinned and thereby abandoned that relationship through the loss of grace. That Original Sin ended up wounding their human nature. This fallen human nature is what we have passed down to us, not the "better" human nature which Adam and Eve first started out with. We all inherit Original Sin and its effects which include a weakened intellect and weakened will. Our intellect is how we know what is good for us and our will is how we choose what is good for us.

Here is the diagnosis. Our weakened intellect doesn't always know what is really good for us and our weakened will chooses some things even when we know they aren't really good for us, like having a dozen Oreo cookies for a snack instead of one. When we come to moral and spiritual choices the decisions often times are harder. When we perceive things wrongly and choose wrongly, it is a sign of spiritual blindness. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* teaches that spiritual blindness is the result of sin, both the effects of Original Sin and personal sin. What we knowingly and deliberately do wrong can keep us locked in a cycle of sin and spiritual blindness. Sin ruptures the right relationship with our own self, with God, and with those around us.

The Good News is that Baptism opens us to God's grace. Receiving God's grace is a daily necessity to overcome the effects of Original Sin which stay with us even after Baptism.

The Sacraments, particularly the Eucharist, give us grace and the better we are prepared for the Sacrament the more grace we can take in. If you are aware of serious sin in your life make use of the Sacrament of Reconciliation so that the doorway to grace is re-opened. Develop a regular prayer life and perform works of charity to help form the habit of choosing and doing what is truly good, not only for you, but for your neighbor as well.
