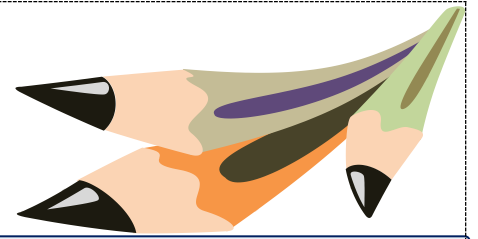
Saints Scramble and Saints Social
