Our Magazine fundraiser began last week and the FIRST turn in date is next Thursday, Sept. 10th.

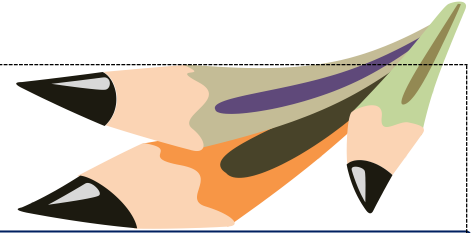
