

Notes Common to Both Parishes

FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

Readings: Is 2:1-5; Rom 13:11-14; Mt 24: 37-44

Theme: Be Watchful! With God revealing Himself in the Lord Jesus, we Christians believe that there is a future for human beings. Life is not an absurdity. Death is not "a transition from being into nothingness," as some contemporary sages allege. Life has meaning. In the confusion of daily life, the Lord Jesus comes to save us from apparent absurdity, from dangerous inertia and the numbness that the sedatives of modern life can bring about. The only prerequisite is that we be watchful and open up to Him and His message found in the Scriptures. "When He comes may He find us watching in prayer, our hearts filled with wonder and praise."

Vocation viewpoint: Stay awake! Be ready! God needs you to make known His imminent presence. (Romans 13.11-14)

Saturday, December 8 is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This solemnity is a Holy Day of Obligation, despite its falling on a Saturday. Catholic faithful are to attend Mass twice on the weekend of December 8/9, once for the Immaculate Conception and once for the Second Sunday of Advent. Holy Day Mass schedule: Friday, Dec. 7th - 5:15 PM Mass at both parishes; Saturday, December 8th - Mass at 8:00 AM at St. Gabriel's and Mass at 10:00 AM at St. John's.

From Catholic Charities: November 13, 2007 As we approach the special day we set aside to offer our Thanksgiving to God for all His blessings, we want to thank you for your support of Catholic Charities. Whether your support comes through donations, referrals, community awareness,

or especially from your prayers, we are very grateful and humbly express our gratitude.

For the past couple of months the main focus of activity at Catholic Charities has been in providing relief from the August flooding that occurred in the southern part of the Diocese. Our focus of that relief work has turned to long-term recovery. We expect that activity to continue for several months, perhaps up to a year. One hallmark of this longterm recovery has been our collaboration with numerous other agencies - e.g., the United Methodist Committee on Relief, Lutheran Social Services, and the Red Cross. Together we have formed a VOAD (Volunteer Organizations Aiding in Disaster) to coordinate the flood recovery. One of the collaborating agencies, Workforce Development, has received a grant that has enabled them to hire three case workers who will be working under Catholic Charities supervision in LaCrosse, Vernon and Crawford Counties. The response to the diocesan-wide appeal for funds for the flood victims has been tremendous. It has enables us to make an impact as people have tried to put their lives back We are particularly grateful at this Thanksgiving for your support and the support of your parishioners for this outreach. In other happenings at Catholic Charities our Eau Claire office location will soon move to new quarters at the former Sacred Heart Parish convent. We hope to be in this new location in early December. We are also exploring possibilities to move our Stevens Point office into the former St. Stephen Parish convent building (which had formerly housed the Stevens Point Area Catholic Schools Office.) If this possibility comes to fruition we expect to move into that location early in 2008. Our Wausau office will also expand into larger quarters at the end of this month within the same building location. All of these moves will result in Catholic Charities being able to provide more and improved service in these areas.

Your assistance, continued support, and participation that you give to your Catholic Charities throughout the year is very much recognized and appreciated. Thank you for all you do in the name of *caritas*, the love and compassion of Jesus. May God continue to bless you and yours with His abundant goodness!
