

Notes Common to Both Parishes

Fourth Sunday of Advent

Readings: Is 7:10-14; Rom 1:1-7; Mt 1:18-24

Theme: Faith. King Ahaz had more faith in a treaty with the Assyrians than in God who approached him through the prophet Isaiah. It is faith in God, who approaches us in the Lord Jesus, that saves us from a meaningless existence. God is willing to step into the darkness of our confusion., if we "let the Lord enter" (Responsorial Psalm).

Loneliness is the greatest threat to happiness. A person alone has no answers. A loner is an unhappy person, depressed, facing absurdity. "Emmanuel" (God with us) in Jesus Christ saves us from ourselves.

Time and again, Christmas reminds Christians that God came to share our human situation on this planet. Looked at in this way Christmas will become a happy and meaningful day for us. "Lord...as Christmas draws near make us grow in faith and love to celebrate the coming of Christ our Savior" (Prayer after Communion).

Vocation Viewpoint: Stop asking for a sign and become one. Consider becoming a priest or religious. (Isaiah 7: 10-14)

Choose life: The Christmas story is one of the greatest pro-life stories of all time! How much clearer could God make the statement that an unborn child is a human being whose passage through the womb has been sanctified by Jesus' similar journey?

The three Jesuit Fathers and all the staff of St. Gabriel's & St. John's and of Prairie Catholic School take this opportunity to extend greetings for the holidays and to thank each and all of you for your continued support throughout the calendar year. A blessed and Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year!

Christmas is not just a commemoration of our Lord's birth, but the celebration of the great "Emmanuel" (God-with -us) mystery. A wealth of symbolism is used in the prayers and Bible readings of this season to shed some light on this tremendous fact: that God wants to share our human condition...the light versus darkness theme is perhaps the most primitive one.

We have no evidence of Christmas earlier than approximately 330 AD and it appears to have been determined not primarily by our Lord's birth date, which is unknown, but rather by the pagan festivals of the winter solstice, when worshippers of the sun celebrated the return of light after the shortest day. At Christmas, Christians celebrate the dawn of God's light shining upon human beings, who go through a valley of darkness.

Over the centuries, popular piety has sentimentalized Christmas into the well-known "baby Jesus" cult. kind of piety is not reflected in the liturgical prayers and scripture readings of the Church. The four Christmas masses, the feast of the Holy Family, The Solemnity of Mary, The Other of God, the Epiphany (Manifestation) of the Lord, and His Baptism elucidate the various aspects of God's self-disclosure in the Lord Jesus, in whom He is really "Immanuel - God-with-us." In Him (Jesus) we see our God made visible and so are caught up in love of the God we cannot see" (Preface to the Eucharistic Prayer at Christmas).
