

## **Notes Common to Both Parishes**

# Feast of the Holy Family

Readings: Sir 3:2-7. 12-14; Col 3:12-21; Mt. 2:3-15, 19-23

Theme: Family Life. We are witnessing a breakdown of the traditional family and its values - filial respect for authority exercised responsibly by parents - and a rising juvenile delinquency. Hence, our society can learn a few things from today's scripture readings.

There is no easy remedy available for today's family crisis. The Christian family is part of a culture in which human beings participate - neighborhood, school, television, friends and recreation patterns. But in stormy weather a ship may get at least some guidance from a beacon! And although authority from the earliest infancy on should be exercised perhaps in a different way, it should not be done away with. Parents could discuss this with their children. A substitute for sound family life has not yet been offered by any of the behavioral sciences.

Today's scripture readings on the family necessarily reflect the patriarchal family pattern, hence the subordinationist family ethic, of the biblical culture. We should distinguish between the core of the Christian ethic and the cloth in which it is wrapped. This cloth is conditioned by time and culture and not necessarily part of the divine message. But the message on family life as such is timeless.

**Vocation Viewpoint:** The priests and religious of the new century are in the care of your family today. Tend to them well; encourage their gifts; pray for their happy response to God's call. (Ephesians 1:3-6, 15-18)

For your information: Members of the Parish Pastoral Council, Finance Council and Education Committee: We will have a joint meeting of all three councils on Thursday, January 10th, in St. John's Church Hall starting at 6:30 PM. Items to be discussed: 1) plans for our hosting a breakfast/informational meeting regarding parish activities and groups on Sunday morning, January 27th, in St. Gabriel's School Hall after the 8:00 AM Mass. All parishioners of both parishes will be invited to this for their better understanding of parish life. 2) plans for our future discernment on the future of Prairie Catholic School. Let us repeat once again, there is NO thought being given to shutting down Prairie Catholic NOR of cutting out 1 or more grade levels in the middle school. Rather, we have to look into a study of student population and determine whether it is better to keep the division we presently have between the primary and middle school sections or to combine them in one physical plant for the future. Having decided this, we will then be ready to determine where the new gym should be located.

This is not a public meeting to be open to one and all attending. With 36 council members it will be challenging enough to keep the dialogue flowing and on track. Once these councils have reached a consensus for recommending a course of action, we will be conducting additional town hall meetings for any and all to attend.
